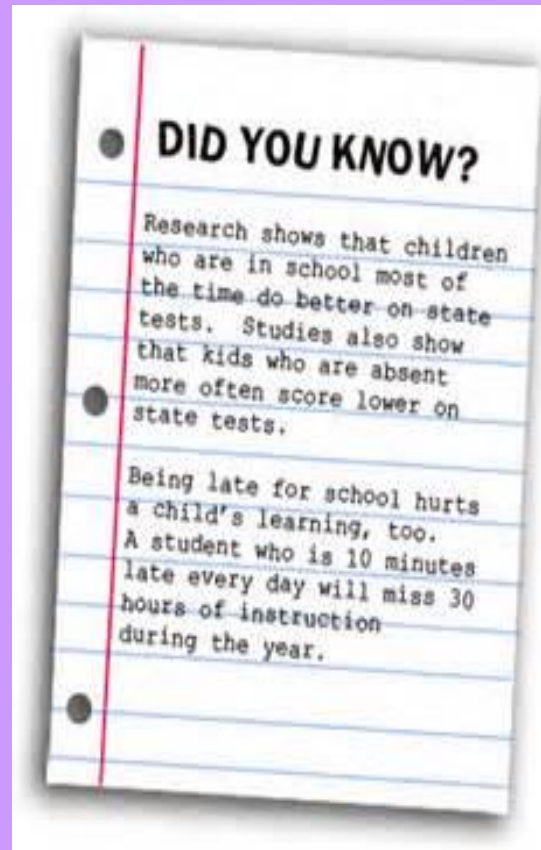

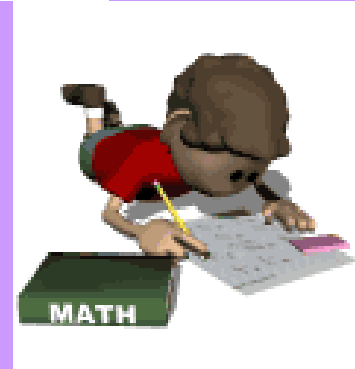

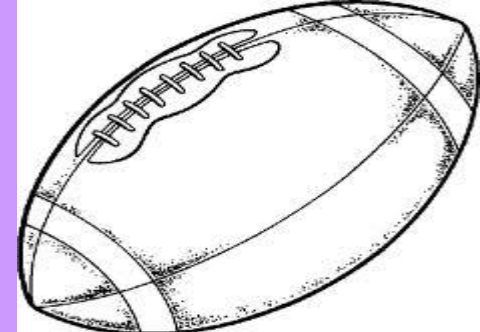

- Maintain grade and discipline standards

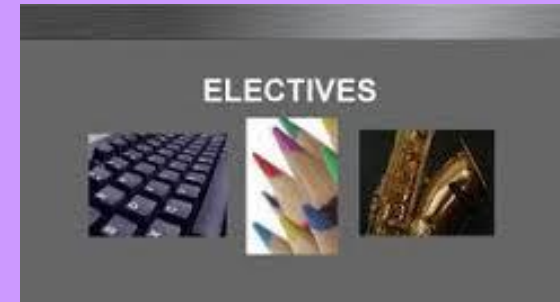
Athletics is more physically rigorous and requires running and conditioning activities

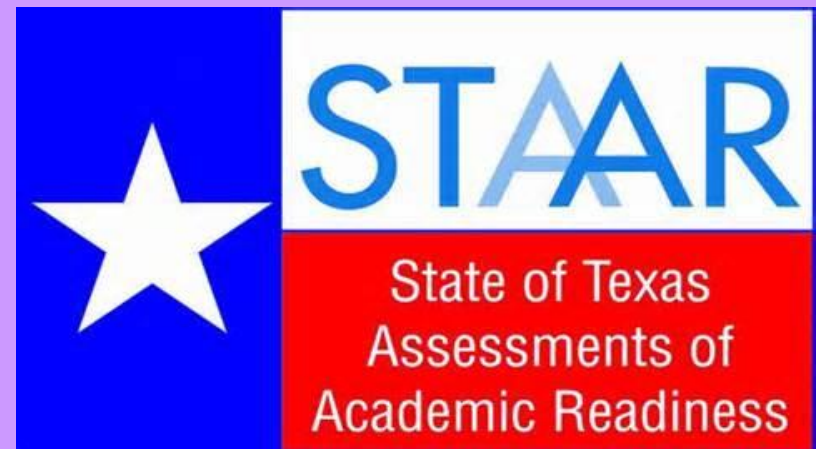
Student Success Initiative (SSI)
